A two-member veterinary doctors' team has arrived from the Haryana Agricultural University. Them apart, our own veterinary doctors, led by KPS Tomar, are also looking after her and we are taking all precautions to avoid any mishap," Mr. Srivastava said.</p> <p>The scientists adopted a more advanced technique than that used in producing Dolly -- the sheep that became the first mammal to be cloned. The 'hand-guided cloning technique', perfected by the NDRI scientists, would allow production of calves of a desired sex.</p> <p>However, scientists have used tissue from foetus to clone the calf this time instead of taking the tissue from the ear of a female buffalo, as was the case last time. The first cloned buffalo was born on February 6, which survived only for a week.</p> <p>India, according to Mr. Srivastava, has the largest population of the best buffaloes in the world. However, the percentage of elite animals is very low and there is a need to enhance the population of these buffaloes.
