## INTERESTING SCRIPTURES CONCERNING THE LAST DAYS

When ministering on the end time or what we call the “last days,” I often look at the predictions of the major prophets of Scripture, t present events fitting the prophetic scenarios, laid out by the inspired men of God in the Holy Word. Recently, however, I have obse taught passages that to me are very significant at this present time.

One is found in a parable of Christ. He stated that, “Men should always pray and not become weary or faint” (Luke 18:1). Christ t parable of a woman who approached a wicked judge, pressing him to avenge her of her enemy. She had to be persistent and con the bench, often feeling the judge was ignoring her. Eventually, the judge moved on her behalf and dealt a blow to her enemies. Je parable with a question: “When the son of man comes will he find faith upon the earth?” (Luke 18:8).

The implication is that in the end time, people must be persistent and not become weary in praying for their personal needs. F have children in rebellion, a marriage in trouble, or a major economic crisis, it is often difficult (especially for a man) to wait and circumstances change or as God intervenes in the situation. One thing I have learned is that just because you have not received : prayer, does not mean that God has not heard your prayer. Daniel is an excellent example. He fasted and prayed for 21 days an hindered by a strong principality hovering over Babylon, blocking the angel of the Lord from bringing the prophetic message to Dani stronghold was broken and the angel came to bring the answer Daniel needed. It seems Jesus was warning us about the days bef the pressures of life and the adversity we would experience could wear us down mentally and emotionally until we would lose faith, give up.

Another passage is found in Matthew 24. Here Jesus revealed the major signs of the time that would precede His Coming. He offended and then says, “He that endures to the end the same shall be saved” (Matt. 24:13). The Greek word endure is hupomeno up under trials. When reading Revelation, we see the word patience mentioned several times (Rev. 13:10; 14:12). The word pa similar to the word endure in Matthew 24. It is the ability to stand and hold up under the weight of a trial or difficulty. Jesus made would be an “endurance test” for believers in the end time.
